**Lesson: Isaiah 9-10 - God of Judgment and Hope**  
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**Isaiah helps the people process the crisis they have just experienced. Isaiah explores three case studies of God's contemporary and future work.**

**CASE STUDY #1 - Galilee and the world (9:1-7)**

- A. Despite the gloom, God's plans include a new king who will fulfill the geographic (Galilee) and political (king) hopes of this prophecy.
- B. There are 4 names of the King and 4 qualities of his rule.
  - a. Names:
    - i. Wonderful Counselor
    - ii. Mighty God
    - iii. Everlasting Father
    - iv. Prince of Peace
  - b. Qualities:
    - i. Abundant Peace
    - ii. Davidic
    - iii. Justice and Righteousness
    - iv. Enabled by the power of God

**CASE STUDY #2 - God's work in N. Israel (9:8-10:4)**

- A. God is angry in four ways.
  - a. God's anger at N. Israel's pride (9:8-12)
  - b. God's anger at N. Israel's leaders (9:13-17)
  - c. God's anger in the destruction of N. Israel (9:18-21)
  - d. God's anger at Judah (10:1-4)



CASE STUDY #3 - God's word with Assyria (10:5-34)

- A. What images are used to convey the work God had Assyria do?
- B. Why did God object to Assyria?
- C. What were God's plans concerning Assyria?
- D. Who is the remnant?
- E. What plan is outlined in 10:27-24?
