Three Observations on the Story of South Judah

- 1. For the most part, Judah maintained political stability.
- 2. Several kings of Judah led remarkable reformation movements. Two examples:
 - a. <u>Hezekiah</u> (II Kgs 18)
 - b. Josiah (II Kgs 22-23)
- 3. God sent many prophets to Judah. Two examples:
 - a. <u>Isaiah</u>
 - b. <u>Jeremiah</u>

The Downfall of South Judah

- 1. In <u>605 BCE</u> the balance of power swings to <u>Babylon</u>. Babylon deports many citizens of Judah, including a young man named <u>Daniel</u>.
- 2. In 598 BCE Babylon invades Judah. A second deportation of citizens occurs.
- 3. In 588 Babylon sets siege to <u>Jerusalem.</u>
 - a. In July of 587 Jerusalem falls to Babylon.
 - b. In <u>August of 587</u> the Babylonians burn the temple & destroy the walls.
